Late Lamented H.B. Baselios Poulos II
Catholicos of the East
Founder Manager and Patron Saint of the College

His Beatitude Baselios Poulos II Catholicos of the East

His Beatitude Baselios Poulos II was born on 12th June 1914, as the second son of Mrs. Elizabeth and Rev. Fr. Joseph Puthussery, at Cherai. The spiritual atmosphere in his home deeply influenced the young Poulos. P.J. Poulos, his official name on records, completed his secondary education from the Rama Varma High School, Cherai. After completing college education at CMS College, Kottayam and Union Christian College, Alwaye, Poulos joined Manjinkkara Mor Ignatius Dayro. Mor A Yulius Elias, the Apostolic delegate of the Holy See of Antioch, Patriarch to Malankara, ordained Poulos as Deacon at Kottayam Valiapally in 1933. He was ordained Kassisso (Full Priest) again by Mor Yulius at Manjinkkara Dayro in 1938. Fr. Poulos served as the Vicar of various churches all over South India for many years. On 19th October 1952, Patriarch H. H. Moran Mor Ignatius Aphrem I ordained Kassisso Poulos as Metropolitan with the name 'Mor Philoxenos' at the Patriarchal Cathedral in Homs, Syria.

Fulfilling the wishes of countless people of faith in India, the Patriarch of Antioch, H. H. Moran Mor Ignatius Yaqub III consecrated Poulos Mor Philoxenos as the Catholicos of the East, under the title 'Mor Baselios Poulos II' on 7th September 1975 at the Patriarchal Cathedral in Demascus. His Beatitude was officially elected as the Malankara Metropolitan at the meeting of the church delegates held on 26th December 1975 at Thuruthissery. His Beatitude made history by consecrating Mor Saverious Zakka, Archbishop of Baghdad, as the Patriarch of Antioch and all the East on September 14, 1980. This was the first time in the annals of the Syrian Orthodox Church that a Catholicos from Malankara officiated the ordination of a Patriarch of Antioch. His Beatitude along with H.H. Moran Mor Ignatius Zakka I was visited the Pope H.H. John Paul II in June 1984 to sign the agreement between the Syrian and Roman Churches.

After serving the Malankara Church as Metropolitan for almost 44 years and as the Catholicos of the East for 21 years, His Beatitude joined the Heavenly Choir on Sunday the 1st September 1996 at the age of 83. The funeral service of Bava Thirumeni on the following day, was attended by thousands of people; a testimony to the affection and esteem that He commanded in the Church and in the society at large. In accordance with His last wish, the mortal remains of the Catholicos Mor Baselios Poulos II were interned in a tomb in Malecruz Dayronear Puthencruz, in Ernakulam District. His Beatitude was widely revered for

It was granted in the name of Baselios Poulouse II as per the Govt. Letter No. 17365/B2/95 HE, dated 21-11-1995 and the sanction order was issued by the Mahatma Gandhi University as per U.O. No. ACA1/Affn/2084/95, dated 28-11-1995.

The realisation of the long cherished dream of the church for starting a college at Piravom was due largely to the unflagging enthusiasm and unstinting support of Shri. T.M. Jacob, the then Hon'ble Minister for Irrigation and Cultural Affairs, Govt. of Kerala.

CONSECRATION

H.B. Baselios Poulouse II, Catholicos of the East, consecrated the college in the presence of H.G. Dr. Geevarghese Mor Gregorios, H.G. Dr. Abraham Mor Severios, H.G. Geevarghese Mor Policarpos and H.G. Dr. Thomas Mor Athanasius on 1st December 1995. The College started functioning on 1st December 1995 in Santhinikethan Buildings of the Evangelistic Association of the East at Pazhoor. Prof. Baby M. Varghese is the founder principal. The college imparts value based and job oriented education to the generations irrespective of caste and creed.

COURSE INAUGURATION

The courses were officially inaugurated on 11th December 1995 by the late Shri. T.M. Jacob, the then Hon'ble Minister in the presence of H.B. Baselios Poulouse II, the founder manager. The B.B.A. class began on the same day with 53 students, and the classes for B.C.A. with 48 students and B.Sc. Electronics with 34 students commenced on 18 December 1995.

The college was formally inaugurated by Shri. E.T. Muhammed Basheer, the then Hon'ble Minister for Education, on March 14, 1996. The late Sri. T.M. Jacob (MLA), Shri. P. P. Thankachan, H. G. REGULATIONS FOR UNDER GRADUATE PROGRAMMES UNDER CHOICE BASED COURSE-CREDIT-SEMESTER SYSTEM AND GRADING, 2013 BATCH ONWARDS

1. Scheme And Syllabus

1.1. The U.G. programmes shall include (a) Common courses I & II, (b) Core courses, (c) Complementary Courses, (d) Open Course.

1.2. Credit Transfer and Accumulation system can be adopted in the programme. Transfer of Credit consists of acknowledging, recognizing and accepting credits by an institution for programmes or courses completed at another institution. The Credit Transfer Scheme shall allow students pursuing a programme in one University to continue their education in another University without break.

2. Programme Structure

There shall be a maximum of three credits for the open course and remaining one credit should be shifted to choice based course or any other core course.

The internal to external assessment ratio shall be 1:4, for both courses with or without practical. There shall be a maximum of **80 marks** for external evaluation and maximum of **20 marks** for internal evaluation. For all courses (theory & practical), grades are given on a 7-point scale based on the total percentage of marks. **(ISA + ESA)** as given below

5.1 Assignments

Assignments are to be done from 1st to 4th Semesters. At least one assignment should be done in each semester.

5.2 Seminar/Viva

A student shall present a seminar in the 5th semester and appear for Viva-voce in the 6th semester.

5.3 Internal Assessment Test Papers

At least one internal test-paper is to be attended in each semester for each course. The evaluations of all components will be published and is to be acknowledged by the candidates.

5.7 Grievance Redressal Mechanism

In order to address the grievance of students regarding the marks obtained in the internal assessment, a two-level Grievance Redressal mechanism is envisaged in the college. A student can approach the upper level only if grievance is not addressed at the lower level.

Level 1: Department Level

Level 2: College level

5.8 External examination

5.8.1 The external examination of all semesters shall be conducted by the University at the end of each semester. Students having a minimum of 75% average attendance for all the courses only can register for the examination. Condonation of shortage of attendance to a maximum of 10 days or 50 hours in a semester subject to a maximum of 2 times during the whole period of the programme may be granted by the University on valid grounds. This condonation shall not be counted for internal assessment.

Benefit of attendance will be granted to students attending University/College union/Co-curricular activities by treating them as present for the days of absence, on production of participation/

attendance certificates, within one week, from competent authorities and endorsed by the Head of the institution. This is limited to a maximum of 10 days per semester and this benefit shall be considered for internal assessment also. Those students who are not eligible even with condonation of shortage of attendance shall repeat the course along with the next batch.

5.8.2 All students are to do a **project**. This project can be done individually or as a group of 3 students. The projects are to be identified during the II semester of the programme with the help of the supervising teacher. The report of the project in duplicate is to be submitted to the department at the sixth semester and are to be produced before the examiners appointed by the University.

5.8.2 There will be no supplementary exams. For reappearance/improvement, the students can appear along with the next batch.

5.8.3 A student who registers his/her name for the external exam for a semester will be eligible for promotion to the next semester.

5.8.4 A student who has completed the entire curriculum requirement, but could not register for the Semester examination can register notionally, for getting eligibility for promotion to the next semester.

5.8.5 A candidate who has not secured minimum marks/credits in internal examinations can re-do the same registering along with the University examination for the same semester, subsequently.

Scheme and Structure of Master of Commerce and Management

Programme Degree Programme

(Under Mahatma Gandhi University Regulations PGCSS 2019)

1. Aim of the Program

The broad aim of the Programme is to provide awareness to the learners regarding the developments in the field of , Commerce, Management, Business and Industry and equip them to develop necessary analytical and managerial skills so as to cope up with the challenges posed by industry and environment, both national and global.

2. Eligibility for Admissions

A candidate who has passed B Com/BBA/ BBM/BFM or any other degree programme awarded under the discipline of commerce/ management and approved by M G University with a minimum of 45% are eligible to pursue the Master of Commerce and Management Programme on a regular basis. Relaxation in percentage is allowed for SC/ST, OEC, SEBC and Physically challenged students as prescribed by the University from time to time.

3. Duration of the Programme

The programme shall be spread over four semesters with each semester having a duration of 90 days.

4. Medium of Instruction and Assessment

The medium of instruction shall be English. There shall be continuous assessment of the students on an internal basis based on the provisions of the Regulations and end semester examinations conducted by University. The final assessment shall be based on both the above components in accordance with the provisions of the Regulations.

5. Faculty under which the Degree is Awarded

The Degree is awarded under the Faculty of Commerce.

6. Note on compliance with the UGC Minimum Standards for the conduct and award of Post Graduate Degrees

The programme is offered in accordance with the UGC Minimum Standards for the conduct and award of Post Graduate Degrees. The student has to secure 80 credits to complete the programme successfully.

7. Specialisations offered

Two streams of Electives will be offered of which the college can select one stream. There will be three courses offered in both streams, spread over third and fourth semesters.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

Students have to abide by the rules and regulations of the college framed in accordance with the norms set by the Government, the University and the Authorities of the College.

Transfer Certificate

No T.C. will be issued to those who owe dues to the college. No fee will be levied from those who apply for T.C. within one year after leaving the college. A fee of Rs. 50/- will be levied from those who apply for T.C. after the lapse of one year from the date of leaving the college. An additional fee of Rs.50/- will be levied from those who apply for duplicate copy of the T.C. (with the recommendation of a first class magistrate).

Every student should take his/her T.C. at the end of his/her course and produce it when he/she is admitted for the next course. 48 hours notice is needed for issuing the certificate.

Attendance

1. Attendance shall be marked at the beginning of each period.
2. Students are advised to compulsorily submit their leave applications when they take leave. The application for leave is available from the college office at the rate of Rs. 2/- per form.
3. The application for **duty leave** will be available from the college free of cost.
4. Students should submit the leave application and get it approved on the very day of reporting at the college after availing leave. For late submission of leave applications, a fine of Rs. 5/- per day will be charged.
5. Application for **duty leave** should be submitted within 3 days of reporting at the college after availing leave. Late applications for duty leave will not be accepted under any circumstances.
6. Students absenting themselves without leave for more than 15 consecutive **working days** will have their names removed from the rolls and they will have to pay all college fees due before they are readmitted.

d) The Enquiry Officer so appointed shall conduct enquiry without delay after gathering oral or written evidence from the complainant as well as the person against whom the allegations/delinquency, were made. The Enquiry Officer also shall give fair and reasonable opportunity to all the parties and shall submit a report to the Principal. Based on the report the Principal shall take appropriate action, which he deems fit, including the imposition of the following punishments.

1. Imposition of fine.
2. Issuance of compulsory transfer certificate.
3. Dismissal from the college.

In the event of imposition of punishment, dismissal or compulsory issuance of transfer certificate, the Principal shall forward the order along with the report to the University.

STUDENTS’ GRIEVANCE REDRESSAL COMMITTEE

There is a Student’s Grievance Redressal Committee in the College constituted by the Principal. The Chairman of the said committee shall be the Principal. The committee shall consist of three teachers nominated by the College Council of whom one shall be a lady teacher. The Chairman of the College Union as well as the Secretary shall be the ex-officio members of the said committee. The committee shall meet once in every month and evaluate the steps taken to frame guidelines or general instructions or directions for the maintenance of peaceful atmosphere in the campus. The students and any unhealthy relationship between the students, students and teachers or students and non-teaching staff of the College and suggest and implement remedial measures.

RIGHT TO APPEAL

A student against whom the disciplinary orders had been passed; shall have a right to appeal to the Board for Adjudication of Students’ Grievances as provided in Chapter 27 of Mahatma Gandhi University Statue 1997. The appellate authority shall have the power to set aside, modify or cancel the order, provided the appeal is found to be genuine and filed within the period of 30 days from the date of receipt of the order. The appellate authority shall also have the power to condone the delay in filling the appeal if it is proved to the satisfaction of the appellate authority by the appellant that he was prevented by sufficient cause from preferring the appeal within the time.

- 7 Staff and students must return all books on or before 31st March every year.
- 8 If the books are not returned on the stipulated date, fine will be levied at the rate of Re.1 per day per book.
9. Students are expected to handle the books carefully. Malpractices like disfiguring the pages by putting marks or writings shall attract severe penalty.
10. No student shall sub-lend his or her library book or card to any other student or person.
11. On demand by the authorities concerned, students are expected to return immediately any library book which is under their custody.
12. Students should not bring books, bags and such other things into the stack room.
13. Students should wear their identity cards (all days) and uniforms (except Wednesdays and Saturdays) while entering the library.

The Procedure for imposition of punishment

- a) The Principal of the college shall be the disciplinary authority in respect of the students in the college.
- b) If it comes to the notice of the Principal that a student or a class of students have committed misconduct as referred to in Rule 5 above and that the Principal is perceives that there is prima facie enough material in the allegation against the delinquent student, he shall immediately pass an order suspending the student/students from the college.
- c) If the Principal thinks that the delinquency alleged in the complaint requires further investigation/enquiry, he shall report the matter to the Staff Council. After reporting the matter and after seeking the views of the Council, the Principal shall appoint a competent teacher, or a team of teachers to enquire into the matter and to submit the report at the earliest.

EXAMINATIONS & TEST PAPERS

1. Exemption from attendance in Examination and Test Paper will be granted only by the Principal.
2. Application for such exemption must be made in person at least two days before the commencement of the examination.
3. In case of illness the Principal may insist on the production of a medical certificate or arrange the applicant to be examined by a competent doctor. The expenses of such examination will have to be borne by the applicant himself.
4. Absence from examinations and test papers without leave will render the student to serious punishment which may amount to withholding of Term Certificate.
5. Defaulters are not exempted from examination and test papers.
6. When re-examination is given, absence from such re-examination will be considered failure. A suitable fee will be collected from students to whom re-examination is offered.
7. Malpractice in test papers and examinations will render the student to severe punishment which may amount to refusal of promotion to the next class, or expulsion from the college.
8. University Exam fee will be collected as per the notice of the principal.
